Treasurer Report:

- Kim asked if we should continue to pursue speakers on Fashion, and whether the Board
 Members consider Fashion as a Decorative Art. Diane suggested that we wait to see how the
 April Speaker, Cameron Silver, is received, before making a decision.

Printing:

Carolyn reported that she continues to update the Patron slide with new members.

Community Relations – Website/Publicity:

- Cathi reported that items to be posted on the website must be submitted to her in PDF form
- Cathi recently sent out the Constant Contact President's email to all members

Public Relations:

- Madeline passed the November Daily Pilot spread featuring pictures from the October Reception.
- Madeline made a motion to increase the PR budget for photographer fees. She suggested \$500 for a photographer at the April Reception at Amaree's, and \$500 for a photographer at the May Special Event with Mark Sikes at the Newport Beach Country Club. Hyla seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

- Madeline reported that 8 members of the press were invited to attend the February reception
 and lecture. LA Times Editor Kathleen Luppi will attend both. In addition, a press release for the
 lecture was sent to 23 press members, and a flyer was sent to ASID (American Society of Interior
 Designers) and the IDI (Interior Design Institute) School of Design.
- Madeline asked everyone to take pictures at the February Reception and send them to her via text or email.

Reception:

- Carole reported that the February Reception is at the home of Larry and Heidi Dorn in Newport Beach. It is of contemporary European décor; interior designer is Lynn Pries.
- It was pointed out that we have \$20 remaining in our Valet budget. Carole made a motion to increase the Valet budget to \$400. It passed unanimously.
